

BOOK REVIEW 'This is Going to Hurt' by Adam Kay

These are a doctor's irreverent and heartbreaking diaries, first published as a rebuke to the then Secretary of State for Health, Jeremy Hunt, during a dispute with junior doctors, over pay and conditions.

They were written between 2010 and 2015 as Kay progressed from Junior Doctor to Senior Registrar specializing in Obstetrics and Gynaecology. (or "brats and twats" as it's apparently known)

They show him tackling many horrific injuries and life threatening emergencies all under intense pressure, working a 97 hour week whilst being poorly paid, sleep deprived and with a shattered social life.


The book revels in the dark comedy of hospital life as it builds to a career- ending incident – a very complicated birth in which the baby died. This devastating experience shook his confidence and he decided to hang up his scrubs.

The book is a rare example of one that makes you laugh and cry. The style is easy to read, written with great wit and very funny although the language is a tad crude in parts. Prudes beware!

It is by turns hilarious, thought - provoking, shocking and humbling.

It has won numerous awards, including Nation's Favourite Book of 2017 and has been in the bestseller lists ever since. Highly recommended.

My friend and I decided to visit the Lion and Fiddle at Hilperton on impulse on Easter Saturday having heard how good it was. We hadn't booked and as you might expect, the restaurant was busy, but we were made welcome and told there would be about a half hour wait for a table.

We decided to stay and settled in the bar with a drink while we studied the menu. There was a good choice of Nepalese dishes and some more traditional Indian dishes to choose from. After a shorter wait than we had anticipated we were shown through to the restaurant.

We both chose starters, my friend opting for a Sekuwa, which is lamb marinated in Nepalese spices and I chose vegetable spring rolls. Both were delicious.

For my main course I had Chicken Tikka Shaslik which was tender and delicately spiced while my companion chose Bhuteko Chicken which was another traditional dish cooked with Gurka spices, onions and tomato. It was quite hot but judging by the empty dishes, he thoroughly enjoyed it! We both ordered a side dish of rice to accompany our main meal.

We didn't have room for pudding so settled for a coffee and in my friend's case, another beer.

Our meal, including a glass of Prosecco, two beers and a coffee came to just over £58 which we thought was good value for money.

The Lion and Fiddle is easy to find being on the Devizes Road in Hilperton and there is plenty of parking.

The staff was attentive and friendly, the service was excellent and so was the food! If you like Indian food, give this a try. It's similar, but different. We will definitely be going back!

Of course, we always called them Mr and Mrs Flower and Mrs Cheesman, as Win was then. She lived in the cottage next to The Gables until she died I believe. The reason my parents moved to Rowde was that my father and his best friend, Len Fenwick, bought Clem's building business (Flower and Son) when he retired and continued to run it out of the yard at The Gables. 
The Greatest Showman

Our bright start leads to their bright future

We have reached the end of term 5 and I am really wondering where the year has gone. After watching the children participate in their first ever sports day at Rowde Primary Academy, I feel so proud of them and privileged to be their teacher. Everyone shone in so many different ways from the naturally competitive children, to the ones that just thoroughly enjoyed their time having a go not because they thought they might win but because having a go is what we believe in. Our theme for so many weeks has been resilience and understanding that even when you find something tough it is the keeping on trying that makes us a learner and a sports person. A have a go attitude is a skill that takes us through life. A person that finds everything easy often comes unstuck when they experience their first difficulty. A person that wants to keep on going will find ways to overcome a difficulty. I have watched children go from non-writers and readers to retelling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk in both writing and orally. This confidence is as a result of the support the children get at home. Home plays such an important role in learning and as a teacher I am always thankful for the support children get.



Your children still talk to me about their home visit all those months ago in September. I remember all of them from the pets I met to what the children wanted to show me. I think the funniest pet was the lovely Chihuahua (yes I looked the spelling up) that perched on my shoulder. His picture is still pride and place in my home and makes me smile. Thank you for all the lovely drinks and cakes. Whilst the home visit was fleeting, I really think it meant so much to the children and has given us a common theme to talk about.

Christmas was charming with the angels and shepherds although I recognised early on that Cygnus class were full of performers and "Greatest Showmen". The children sparkled and performed, looking amazing in all the costumes provided by you. The visit to the Pantomime brought memories in itself with children "flossing" and catching the attention





of the cast on stage. They have persevered in trying to teach me and whilst I am resilient, I just don't get it. The children are just too fast.

January saw the snow and the floods in Cygnus class where we rapidly decamped to anywhere in the school that would have us. The children were brilliant in dealing with change and continuing their learning as though nothing had happened. This really was testament to their confidence and how settled they were as well as your continued support. We were ever so pleased however to get back to our lovely classroom and rediscover toys and books and make us appreciate what we had.

Easter came and went and your children returned more grown up than ever. Dare I say I quite missed them over Easter. With my own children being 20 and almost 18, I really look forward to seeing what each day brings from when I open the door in the morning to saying goodbye in the afternoon. It is almost full circle in the first year at Rowde and we are starting to think about Cygnus as being in Year 1. Parish Council meeting - Update

The Annual Village Meeting took place on 23rd May 2019. Unfortunately, the Rowde Village News had gone to print before an update was available. Please see the next issue of the Rowde Village News for an update.

The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meetings on 3rd April & 8th May 2019 were:

Goodbye – to Steve Mundy, who has been on the Parish Council for seven years and as Chair for three of those. During that time, Steve has watched over the Parish Council finances, led the Council to great success and carried out many, many jobs around the village, including fixing play equipment, mending footpath bridges and putting up the village Christmas tree.

The Parish Council thanked Steve for working tirelessly for the Parish Council and for ensuring that all of those little jobs got done.

Wiltshire News – in Rowde Statutory Consultation on Special Schools Rowdeford School

There has been a further extended consultation on the future of three Special Schools in Wiltshire. Wiltshire Council has withdrawn the statutory proposal to close Larkrise, St Nicholas and Rowdeford schools and create one new, larger school in Rowde by 2023.

In the summer, Wiltshire Council will provide revised statutory proposals which will go out to consultation for a further four weeks.

Traveller Encampment – The Common

There was a long discussion about the travellers' encampment on the Common. This has been reported to Wiltshire Council whose designated team are dealing with the issue.

- There some discussion about the ownership of the Common and whose responsibility it is to move the travellers on. Whilst parts of the Common are registered to the Parish Council, the Highway and the immediate area surrounding it is the responsibility of Wiltshire Council.
- There was concern about the length of time it has taken for the travellers to be moved on. Wiltshire Council consider the welfare of children and vulnerable adults first in such cases. A notice to quit has now been issued.

Rowde News

Highways Speeding

 The Clerk has reported concerns with speeding taxis along Marsh Lane to Wiltshire Council's Passenger Transport department. The Parish Council has been advised that all drivers will be written to, to remind them of their responsibility and to warn them of the consequences of failing to meet Wiltshire Council's strict requirements.

• The Clerk has made a request to the Devizes Community Area Transport Group (CATG) for reminder sings of the 30mph speed limit on the High Street end of Marsh Lane.

Parking problems

- Parking problems continue in Springfield Road, Silverlands Road, Ferris Close, Reed Place and also Maundrell Close. All drivers are reminded to park safely and respectfully of residents.
- The Clerk has met with the Chair of governors from Rowde Primary School to talk about problems caused by school drop off and pick up. It was noted that bus routes have stopped or changed since the school was built in 2006 and also more children are travelling to the school from outside of the village.

Wiltshire Council Highways update

• The Clerk shared the Highways update from Cllr Wayman which outlines major county clean-ups; 'Sparkle Days' part of Wiltshire Council's 'Clean Up Wiltshire' initiative; additional weed control; discretionary gully emptying; and Wiltshire council's investment in a JCB highway maintenance ditch digging work. The newsletter is available on request.

Rowde Village Walks booklet

• If anyone is interested and has some spare time, Barrie Barrett is looking to revise his Rowde Village Walks booklet. Help is need to walk the walks, note any changes, to add new walks to the booklet and to help with the reproduction. Barrie can be contacted on 01380 722186 if you are able to help.

Planning Applications

- 19/01982/FUL Oakwood Stud, Marsh Lane: for the use of land and stables for a new equine business; extension to stables; erection of storage barn; stationing of mobile home (resubmission of 18/02904/FUL). The Parish Council re-iterated its opinion that the site is too small for the size of business that is being proposed.
- 19/01258: Land south of Rowde Lane, Rowde revised drawings have been submitted to Wiltshire Council showing existing and proposed buildings. The existing horse shelters do not appear to have planning permission and are being applied for on this application, therefore the application is in part retrospective. The Parish Council did not have objections to the application as long as the Common is not disturbed for access.
- The Parish Council raised concerns about the permanency of the travellers on the Common, across the crossroads at Berhills land. The Clerk was asked to raise this with Wiltshire Council.
- 19/02459/FUL Wardley, Paradise Lane, Rowde: new single storey rear extension with internal alterations and new porch. The Parish Council had no objections.
- A reduction to the hours applied for by the Scooter Rally organisers has been submitted to Wiltshire Council. The hours for music have been reduced to:
- Live Music Friday 18:00hrs to 23:00hrs and Saturday 14:00hrs to 23:30hrs.

Recorded Music – Friday 17:00hrs to 23:00hrs and Saturday 12:00hrs to 23:30hrs.

- 19/03283/FUL Cedarwood, Cock Road, Rowde: demolition of existing bungalow and garage, erection of 2 chalet style bungalows. There was some concern about plans to increase the footprint by building two houses on the site and the impact it would have on the vehicular access to the proposed development on the adjacent Malthouse Farm. The Parish Council noted that there are no solar panels featured in the drawings of the proposed new buildings and asked if they will be a requirement for the new build. After a discussion, the Parish Council said that they had no objections to the application.
- 19/02772/FUL Rowde Mill, Rowde: Retrospective planning application for the erection of two timber structures. Comments by 10th May 2019. Bromham Parish application. A letter of objection was received from a local resident stating concerns that the new buildings were to be used as possible holiday chalets and the impact that the buildings would have on the natural environment. Rowde Parish Council thought that the outbuildings in question were well concealed within the property grounds and would not be easily visible from neighbouring land or public footpaths. The conservation concerns put forward were discussed and the buildings were deemed to be of minimal ecological impact considering their placement within the walled garden/nursery area and not within a natural or semi-natural habitat of high ecological importance. The Parish Council were, therefore, in support of the application
- 19/02978/FUL: 55 Springfield Road, Rowde: Amended plans to demolish garage and greenhouse, construct single storey extension to extend kitchen, construct detached brick store and provide parking for 2 vehicles. The Parish Council had no objections to the revised plans.
- 19/03717/FUL: Vine Cottage, 26 Bunnies Lane, Rowde: change of use from bed and breakfast to residential. The Parish Council had no objections. Village Appearance
- Thank you to Mrs. Lemon for replanting the planter situated on Marsh Lane at the junction with Rowde Court Road.
- The grounds maintenance contract for the village has been reviewed and a new contractor has been appointed. It was agreed to accept the most competitive, compliant bid.
- It was agreed that the new contractor will re-turf the Hill. This work has now taken place.
- The Clerk has met with the Neighbourhood Officer for Aster to discuss parking issues in Springfield Close & Maundrell Close, and overgrown hedgerows (along the Church drive and adjacent to Church View).
- The 'Reed Place' sign has been replaced.
- The bin on the corner of Cock Road/High Street has been moved by Wiltshire Council to the High Street and the junction with Marsh Lane.
- The Clerk has followed up on the arrangements for Wiltshire Council to send the road sweeper with ripper brush through the village.
- The gate to the toddlers' play area has been fixed.
- The Clerk has chased repairs to the damaged culvert opposite Tanis Farmhouse, on Conscience Lane. The road still floods in this area whenever there is heavy rain. The whole section of road needs repairing as the tarmac has rippled opposite the school.

RECIPE Beginner's Bacon and Brie Quiche

INGREDIENTS:

- 25g butter
- 2 large onions
- 350g shortcrust pastry
- plain flour, for dusting
- 200g pack smoked bacon (Sandridge farm or Dragon brand is available at the shop) if you don't like bacon you can substitute 1/2 a leeks.
- 300g pot double cream (Langley farm available at the shop)
- 100ml milk
- eggs (from John Butlers hens!)
- 140g brie, (or any of our cheddars, if brie isn't your thing!)

METHOD:

1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 with a large flat baking sheet inside. This is for you to get your tart tin in and out the oven without mayhem and helps prevent a soggy bottom.

Melt the butter in a large non-stick frying pan, add the onions and cook gently for 10 mins. Season with a bit of salt and pepper.

Flour your sideboard and roll pastry out large enough to fit your 25cm loose-bottomed tart tin, including a little overhang of pastry all the way round the top – this is because it will shrink back a bit. If there is massive overhang anywhere, trim with scissors. Chill for 15 mins.

- 2. Line the pastry case with a sheet of baking paper and fill with ceramic baking beans (if you don't have any you can use a handful of uncooked dried beans). Bake for 15 mins. Remove the parchment and beans, then return to the oven for 10 mins more, until the pastry looks cooked like shortbread.
- 3. Meanwhile, fry the bacon (or chopped leek). Beat the cream, milk and eggs, then stir in the bacon and half the cheese. You can season with pepper but go easy with salt.
- 4. Remove the pastry case from the oven and reduce heat to 190C/170C fan/gas 5. Spoon the onions over the base of the pastry case. Pour in the eggy cheesy bacon mixture, then scatter with the remaining cheese. Bake for 25-30 mins until golden and the filling is just set with a slight wobble in the centre. Trim excess overhang pastry after 10 mins cooling time.



Message from the Rectory

Dear Friends,

In June, the church remembers Saint Columba, who died on June 9 th 597. Columba was born and brought up in Ireland, fostered by a priest and then taught and mentored by Bishop Finnian. At the age of about 44, he left Ireland with twelve companions, having been given some land on lona by one of the Scottish rulers who had settled there from Ireland. Some traditions say that he made a vow after becoming involved in a tribal battle to bring pagans to faith. But it is known that in 563 he left by boat for lona There, Columba established a monastery, and then a series of linked monasteries, and travelled quite widely to bring the local tribes to faith in Christ. He was particularly known for listening to God and then encouraging certain chiefs and kings accordingly, even when this meant going against his own personal feelings. He studied the scriptures in both Latin and Greek and was known for caring for the poor and those in need. Under his influence, his monasteries took on these traditions. It was his example, as well as his knowledge of the Bible, that persuaded others to come to faith. Columba's mission to spread the good news of God's love through faith in Jesus took him to travel throughout Scotland. When Columba died in 597, others took on his work. Some of his followers travelled further south, to Lindisfame, and founded a monastery there. The community based in Iona continues to reach out in love to those on the fringes of our society. Saints like Columba can inspire us to live similar lives - not perhaps leaping into small boats to cross the Irish sea! Rather in reaching out in love to everyone in need. Whether we care for others in quiet, individual ways, or by being part of a church or community organisation,

there are lots of stories of the care and friendship, love and support that have been shared here in Rowde. It's life- changing stuff. If you would like to come and join us in Church, I hope you will feel that same tradition of mission that Saint Columba embodied – of reaching out to share what it means to know and love God.


Entertainment was provided by a jazz band and there was face-painting and Mad Pete, a children's entertainer from Pewsey.

HAVE YOU SIGNED UP TO COMMUNITY MESSAGING?

Wiltshire Police use an email alert system called Community Messaging, also known as Neighbourhood Alert, across Wiltshire and Swindon to provide real time information to subscribing residents and businesses.



This is a free service and once subscribed you can choose what sort of alert to receive and how to receive them. This way the alerts will be tailored specifically to your interests and delivered by email, text or phone.

Community Messaging allows Wiltshire Police, and carefully selected partners, to help keep communities better informed about police and crime updates affecting their local area. The messages can even be sent to individual postcodes.

Although Wiltshire Police is the main source of information the system is also used by Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue, Wiltshire and Swindon Neighbourhood Watch, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Gas Emergency Service and Action Fraud (the national centre for fraud and cybercrime). All these partners provide relevant information to help keep you safe and secure.

You can respond directly to messages and rate the value/relevance of alerts on a scale of 1-5. Your feedback can be most useful to provide first hand intelligence relating to alerts but also to allow us to assess the effectiveness of the system so we keep messages and alerts relevant.

The relevance of alerts is controlled by users through the selection of specific schemes on the system; Neighbourhood watch is one popular choice but there are also groups for Community Speed Watch, Youth Clubs and Groups, Church Watch, Horse Watch, Farm Watch and many others. All can be selected or deselected as required and all have the ability for you to feed intelligence to crime prevention partners.

It should be emphasised that Community Messaging is not a way of reporting crimes -

always call 999 in an emergency or 101 in a nonemergency situation.

Community Messaging doesn't replace the social media activity that the force uses to reach out to communities but works alongside it to make sure that messages are received in a timely way. With changes to the algorithms that the leading social media platforms use to distribute information you are possibly seeing far fewer of the posts issued than you did five years ago. By signing up to Community Messaging you will be sure to receive the information directly. www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk

....and from our local PCSO: ADVICE FOR VICTIMS OF FRAUD

If you suspect you've been a victim of fraud involving credit or debit cards, online banking or cheques, you should report it to your bank or card company.

They are responsible for undertaking further investigation and reporting criminal activity to us where appropriate.

Fraud that doesn't involve your bank or card company should be reported to the business or organisation concerned. Depending on their advice, you may then need to report this to us on 101.

Where an additional crime has been committed with the fraud, for example, you have had your wallet or purse stolen or the card used fraudulently was taken as a result of a burglary, then this should still be reported to us on 101.

Some steps you can take to protect yourself:

- Make sure you keep a record of all communications.
- Get a copy of your personal credit report from one of the credit reference agencies Experian, Equifax and Call Credit. A paper version of your report is available from £2. If applications for credit have been made in your name you can ask to have any incorrect information removed.
- Consider contacting CIFAS the UK's Fraud Prevention Service, to apply

for protective registration. Once you have registered, CIFAS members will carry out extra checks whenever anyone applies for a financial service using your address.

 If you suspect mail theft, contact the Royal Mail Customer Enquiry Number on 08457 740740 or visit their website

If you are a victim of card fraud or online banking fraud you have protection through legislation, which states that you will not be liable for any losses unless you have acted fraudulently or without reasonable care.

Action Fraud can provide help and information online or by calling 0300 123 2040.

LANDLORD AND TENANT DISPUTES

Landlord/ tenant relations are a very complex area of law and the following advice is only to be used as a guide. For more complete advice you should contact the Environmental Protection department of your local authority.

The proper procedure that a landlord must follow to legally evict a tenant is:

- A legal written notice
- A court order for possession and
- A bailiffs warrant (to be enforced by a County Court bailiff).

Until all these three steps have been taken, the tenant has a right to stay in the property.

NEIGHBOUR COMPLAINTS AND BOUNDARY DISPUTES

Neighbour complaints can take many forms. Please contact us about the specific nature of the issue/complaint and we can advise further.

We do not have the power to deal with boundary disputes. This is a civil issue and you need to seek the advice of a solicitor to resolve any boundary issues you may have. It will be worthwhile contacting your bank or building society (or whoever holds your deeds) to check the boundaries.

HOUSE PARTIES AND ILLEGAL RAVES

If your neighbours are having a noisy house party, we have no powers of prosecution for noise offences. You need to contact the Environmental Health Department of your local authority.

If you believe that an illegal rave is taking place then contact us.

Some signs to look out for are:

- Groups of cars and young people gathering in unusual places such as industrial sites, small villages or remote rural areas
- Interest in certain remote, rural sites

such as quarries, particularly by people that look out of place or you wouldn't expect to see

• Cars and vans delivering generators to rural locations.

MOTOCROSS BIKE STOLEN FROM ROWDE

Police are hunting a burglar who broke into a garage of a house in Rowde and stole a motocross bike.

The theft at Tanis was reported on May 5. Other items taken include a Husquarvana concrete cutter, a Fly motocross bike helmet, a Palm bora drysuit and a Rubi tile cutter.

DAYLIGHT ROBBERY IN ROWDE

WILTSHIRE police is appealing for information following a burglary in Rowde on 10th April.

A house in Springfield Road belonging to a man in his 80s was broken into sometime between 9am and 2.50pm.

Two glass doors were smashed to gain access to the house and a search was carried out inside, at this stage, it is not clear if anything has been stolen.

Det Con Cerys Powell said: "We have conducted some house to house enquiries and we now believe that the burglary may have taken place in the morning at around 9.30am but we are keen to hear from anyone who saw any suspicious people or vehicles in the area between 9am and 2.50pm.

"If you were driving in the area and have dash-cam footage, please get in touch as you could have captured something which may seem irrelevant at first glance, but could be crucial to our investigation."

PLAN TO BUILD CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE AT ROWDE IS APPROVED

St Nicholas and Larkrise special schools will close down to make way for a Wiltshire Council run centre of excellence in Rowde, it has been decided.

Cabinet members voted unanimously to approve the one special school plan, which will see £35m invested into a campus site in Rowde to provide 220 extra school places by 2023.

Parents spoke passionately both for and against the plan with families from St Nicholas in Chippenham and Larkrise in

Trowbridge schools campaigning outside county hall on Wednesday morning.



Parents protest over special school consultation

Parent Melissa Loveday said: "We feel patronised. The council has rehashed their one-school proposal. Our petitions signed by 7500 people each is staggering evidence of the feeling of the public keeping the school in their communities and has been ignored. Our fight is not standing in the way of progress but ensuring things are done right."

Amy Bates speaking on behalf of governors at St Nicholas school said: "The paper focuses too strongly on value for money rather than providing diversity and choice. The majority of issues ignore parental choice."

Some parents at Rowdeford praised the location and community feel the school currently has there. One mum became emotional as she told councillors of her son James's progress since joining the school. The centre is set to have a specific medical centre with paediatric nurses described by cabinet member for children Laura Mayes as "absolutely key".

Larkrise and St Nicholas will now stay open until the new school has been completed and it is deemed appropriate for the children to change locations. A new management team will take over all three schools by September 2021.

Mike Loveridge, head teacher of Rowdeford School spoke in support of the new site and said: "Rowdeford parents believe outstanding provision is most important. A lot of parents said they would rather travel for outstanding services than one that is less on the doorstep. I am deeply concerned about the length of time this consultation has taken and hope we can press on with what is most important, support for the children."

Cllr Bridget Wayman added: "We are not looking to institutionalise them by putting them out into the sticks, that is really not what we want to do. We want to offer the best

and safest spaces and this is best achieved through a campus of small classrooms." Cllr Mayes said: "This is about investment in inclusion and not at all about saving money. We have to make a decision for every child with SEND for now and in the future. I'm proud to say we are investing in a new facility."

The decision will now go to the Secretary of State for approval.

CALLING "TIME" AFTER FIFTY YEARS AS AN RBL POPPY COLLECTOR

George Stevens has clocked up 50 years as a Royal British Legion Poppy Collector, though he can recall helping his father as a young boy for several years before he went solo. Since being married to Pat, he has been ably assisted by her in the annual Poppy Appeal. George joined the RBL through his being a member of the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry, the oldest Yeomanry Regiment in the British Army.



Each year they have liaised with the Poppy Appeal Co-ordinator of the Devizes RBL Branch, requesting the collection boxes, distributed boxes in the shops (now only one) and the pubs. George has co-ordinated those Poppy Collectors who do the door to door collection, though he has taken the lion share on himself.

Once the Appeal has finished the boxes within the Branch's area are centralised and George and Pat together with other RBL selected members do the final adding up.

So on behalf of the Royal British Legion and Rowde Village in particular a huge thank you to George and Pat of 50 years dedication and here is hoping you can sit back and relax in November 2019.


