The January book chosen is "The Woman in the White Kimono" by Ana Jones to be discussed at the meeting on 22nd January.





NEWS FROM ROWDE PRIMARY ACADEMY

Our bright start leads to their bright future

The new year is well underway, and only two weeks in to the new term, it feels like we were never away. This is a time of change for the school, as we improve the curriculum and outcomes for our children. As is always the case with significant change, there are many points of view to contend with, and challenges to be faced. But I am reminded of the Einstein's definition of madness – doing the same things over and over again, whilst expecting things to be different. They will only be different if we make them so.

To this end, and in addition to the new curriculum and improved teaching, we are placing a new emphasis on our values – which we call 'We Are Rowde'. These embody the things we believe in as a school, but extend well beyond the classroom. Every assembly, every lesson and every conversation refocuses the children on what it means to be part of our school and our broader community. Everything you would expect to be there is included, values such as kindness, empathy, commitment, determination and honesty. And, after only a fortnight, we are beginning to see the impact.

Only this morning, pupils approached me in the hurly-burly of the playground, with a detailed plan of how to raise money to help save the wildlife stricken by the Australian fires. They were insistent, determined and – most impressively – had done their research on how to raise money, and which of the many charities would have the greatest impact. That's the kind of empathetic, caring community they want to be part of, and the school will help that to happen.

There are, of course, countless worthy causes closer to home, and much to be involved with at a local level. We want to be part of these too, and I would love to hear from local organisations, charities and causes with which the school community can engage. What happens in the classroom will always be my greatest priority, but education goes far beyond. At Rowde Primary, we are not just encouraging great scholars, but wonderful young people too.

Rowde Parish has taken the opportunity to join with Devizes & Bishops Cannings to create a new, joint Neighbourhood Plan.

A neighbourhood development plan (NDP) is a legally binding document. It would be drawn up by our community together with Devizes, and Bishops Cannings, to give us greater control over development and planning in our village. It means no planning and development can take place without reference to our plan.

A neighbourhood development plan establishes general planning policies for the development and use of land in a neighbourhood, such as where new homes and offices should be built and what they should look like The plan can be detailed or general, depending what local people want. It is a chance for everyone to be consulted on what is important to them in their local environment.

It is our chance to shape our village's future.

Some local communities have neighbourhood plans already, others are working on plans. Rowde currently does not have a neighbourhood plan and it leaves us vulnerable to large developments.



Parish Council meeting - Update

The information below is current at the time of the Parish Council meeting. If events or information have changed since the meeting, it will not be reflected here. The key areas discussed at the Parish Council meetings on 11th December 2019 and 8th January 2020 were:

Precept

The Chair outlined the forthcoming financial issues that face the Parish Council. These include possible legal issues around 'The Common', the creation of the Tanis footpath, funds to deal with potential fly-tipping and funds to create a joint Neighbourhood Plan with Devizes. The budget suggested a higher increase in the precept. It was agreed to propose a lower increase of 9% in the village precept. This will result in a precept of £37,973.42. Payment for a band D house will increase from £70.58 to £76.93 per annum: an increase of £6.35 over the year.

Cllr Cuthbert updated the Parish Council on forthcoming council tax increases for Wiltshire Council. Wiltshire Council will set a precept increase of 2%, in addition to an adult social care levy. The combined council tax increase will be 3.99%. Wiltshire Council is conducting public meetings around the county about the proposal. The details of all of the public meetings are on Wiltshire Council's website.

NEW builds in Rowde!

Wiltshire Council is proposing to build on land adjacent to Reed Place. It has been proposed that the following homes will be built next to Reed Place:

- 1 x 1 bed social rented bungalow
- 2 x 1 bed social rented houses
- 2 x 2 bed social rented house
- 1 x 2 bed social rented bungalow
- 2 x 1 bed shared ownership house
- 2 x 2 bed shared ownership house
- 1 x 3 bed rented property

This is in response to the recent Housing Needs Survey which was circulated to everyone in the parish and is supported by the Parish Council.

Neighbourhood Plan for Rowde

Rowde will join with Devizes Town Council and Bishops Cannings Parish Council in a new, joint

Neighbourhood Plan. A date has been set for the first Neighbourhood Planning meeting in Rowde. It will be held on Tuesday 11th February 2020, 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

It will be an opportunity for residents to discuss their priorities for the village and the future.

The Chair asked for residents to consider areas in the village that could be provided for housing and/or industrial use.

- 19/10318/VAR. Malthouse Farm 1 Bunnies Lane Rowde Devizes Wiltshire SN10 2QB. Variation of condition 3, 4, 5 and 19 of application 17/08775/ FUL. The Parish Council had no objections.
- 19/10652/FUL Application for Full Planning Proposal:- Rear conservatory: 34 Springfield Road, Rowde, Devizes, Wiltshire, SN10 2NY. The Parish Council had no objections.
- 19/10592/FUL: Kanihavet, Berhills Lane, Seend, SN10 1ST: Application for Full Planning. Proposal:-Demolition of existing double garage, erection of two storey rear extension to dwelling and erection of detached triple bay garage. Porch to front of dwelling. The Parish Council had no objections.
- 19/11793/FUL: Land adjacent to, 41 Tower View, Rowde, Devizes, SN10 2PT Application for Full Planning: Proposal: Construction of a 3 bedroom dwelling. The Clerk asked Wiltshire Council for an extension in time to consider this application but was refused due to an administration error at Wiltshire Council which meant there were delays in getting the application out to consultees. The Parish Council has discussed this proposal at a previous meeting and did not have any objections at that stage.

Safety

The Parish Council has donated £300.00 to the South Western Ambulance Charity towards the cost of Raizer chair which can be used in the village to safely help people who have fallen down and who are unable to get up unaided. Further donations of £300.00 have been made privately.

Pavements

The pavements around the village, including along the A342 have been sided out by our grounds contractor. Large amounts of soil have been removed to reveal the full width of the pavements, to improve pedestrian safety. There has been lots of positive feedback from residents. The Parish Council thanked the grounds contractor for all of the work that has been carried out.

It was proposed at the meeting that the work should be continued to side out the pavements along Marsh Lane, from Broad Corner to the Marsh Lane bridge, so that the whole village has been completed.

Highways

The Hill

There are witnesses to very large vehicles accessing Cock Road from the High Street and causing damage to the Hill.

 The Parish Council is investigating whether some of the grass can be removed from the Hill to be replaced with hard standing.

Update on the recent accident on the High Street, near to the junction with Close Lane.

A car has crashed into the wall near Close Lane and caused considerable damage. It is noted that the road surface is inadequate at the section and has no surface grip. Resurfacing work is due to take place in February along A342.

Discussion on the need for further waiting and parking restrictions

- It was agreed that the Parish Council will request that double yellow lines are installed on the A342 from the junction with Bunnies Lane to Slade's Garage.
- The Parish Council considered a request from a resident to extend double yellow lines further down Springfield Road and thought that this would exacerbate parking issues around the village.

Update on Conscience Lane resurfacing

The new road surfacing will be re-laid in April 2020 due to the extensive degradation of the new recycled surface. The most serious potholes will receive immediate attention.

Road Closures

There will be a temporary closure from Cock Road, Rowde to Netherstreet, Bromham for carriageway resurfacing works. This will take place on 14th February 2020. There will be a further temporary closure from the Marsh Lane junction with the High Street to the Conscience Lane junction of Devizes Road for carriageway resurfacing. This will take place on 17 February 2020.

Security Issues

The car park by the allotments and playing field is being used for illicit activity. This has been reported to the Police who will include the area in their rounds.

 It was agreed that the Parish Council will purchase a camera and a new security padlock for the allotment area. The Clerk has been asked to purchase two signs to warn people that the area is under CCTV surveillance.

Large Playing Field

The large playing field is being used again after the wet weather. There is ongoing concern about damage that is being done to the pitch areas.

Village Christmas Tree

The Parish Council thanked everyone who was involved with the Christmas tree project, including local residents and Parish Councillors and their families, and the Village Hall Committee. Thanks were also given to J Collett for disposing of the tree.

Message from the Rectory

Dear Friends,

Have you ever sat down to do a task, and found your mind wandering? Perhaps towards something you

would rather be doing, or a different job that needs to be done, distracting from the matter in hand? It can be hard to control our mind and our thoughts – it's as though our mind has 'a mind of its own', and pays attention to certain things without our permission!

It's one of the pitfalls when we stop 'doing' and spend some time meditating or praying. Our thoughts wandering all over the place can be frustrating, but it can actually be part of our spiritual growth. If it happens to you, try to notice what it is that grabs your attention. Over time, you can spot a pattern – if you are always distracted by jobs that need to be done, try praying in a different space, perhaps outside where you're surrounded by nature, or in church when it's quiet.

Sometimes, when we pay attention to our thoughts, we can begin to diagnose other aspects of our life that need some change. Perhaps we will think of people we need to forgive, or reconnect with, or relationships we need to work at. If our mind strays to past events, perhaps there is something there for which we need healing. Forgiving other people can be hard – if it's not possible to have a conversation with them, start by thinking about forgiving them as being part of your own healing.

Even if our thoughts wander, it's good for us just to stop and "be". Evelyn Underhill, a Christian writer and spiritual advisor, said this:

Most people spend their lives trying to conjugate the verbs 'to want,' 'to have' and 'to keep'— craving, clutching, clinging—when all the Spirit wills us to do is to conjugate the verb 'to be'.

We don't earn God's approval or love by what we do or have or want, but just by being. We can't make God love us any more than he does, or any less. God adores us, and it is when we stop, and rest, that we can best appreciate that.

If you would like some help in stopping and being, come and join us in Church. In our organised worship, or just to spend some time in a space set aside for being with God – our buildings are open during daylight hours. And on 29th February we are holding a quiet day, joint with Rowde church from 10am to 4pm. It will allow us time and space to be in God's presence. 

ROWDE SCHOOLGIRL MAKES MAGIC REINDEER FOOD TO HELP VULNERABLE SURVIVE WINTER



At a time of year when most children were writing their Christmas lists, one little girl was only thinking of others.

Primrose Hillier, eight, became one of Wiltshire Community Foundation's youngest fundraisers when she raised almost £60 by selling magic reindeer food at her school's Christmas fair.

The Rowde Primary Academy pupil was inspired to help the appeal which provides £300 grants for elderly and vulnerable people in fuel poverty, after watching a TV documentary.

"It was about these children who came home from school and there was no heating and they had to go to bed wearing their coats because it was so cold. It was very sad," she said.

"I decided to help by making the reindeer food. You can put it on the garden and then when Santa comes the reindeer will have something to eat because it's hard work pulling the sleigh." Primrose, whose mum Nicola is grants officer at the Community Foundation, spent more than two days making 42 bags of the food, made from porridge oats and seeds, and raised £58.75. Her efforts went towards earning her a charity badge at 1st Devizes Brownies.

CANCER RESEARCH AND SCHOOL TRUST PRAISE WAYNE'S ONE MAN STAND



Old soldier Wayne Cherry has been hailed a hero by two charities after raising cash by holding 100 hours of remembrance in the lead up to November 11.

Mr Cherry was on parade in both The Brittox, Devizes and in his home village of Rowde to honour the fallen. He also raised £1,110.44 for Cancer Research UK and £1,335.87 for the Rowdeford Charity Trust.



He has now handed over the money in two cheque presentations. In Devizes he met with Frank Marshall chairman of the Devizes Fundraising Committee of Cancer Research UK, who thanked Wayne for his generosity in standing in all weather to raise the money that will go towards research for finding a cure for cancer.

In Rowde he met with Mike Bowden the president of the Rowdeford Charity Trust which supports Rowdeford special school.

RVN editor Alan Watters said: "Wayne is our village hero. He staged a stand of remembrance on The Hill in Rowde and The Brittox in Devizes and over 32 days he stood for a total of 104 hours."

Mr Cherry posted regular updates of his remembrance on social media and wrote movingly of the many different people he met. He said: "It was a small token of my gratitude of those who paid the ultimate price for the freedom we enjoy today."

CHLOE'S CONCERT FEATURED CUTHBERT THE GOOSE

Miss Chloe Jordan gave a concert at St John's Church in Devizes on December 7th with singers from the CJ School of Music to support the Caen Countryside Centre at Rowde.

Miss Jordan, who runs CJ Music School in Potterne, is a regular at the wildlife centre run by Chris and Hellie Franklin.



Miss Jordan said: "One of the songs I performed made number one on the comedy iTunes list."

Her song about Cuthbert the Goose gained international recognition thanks to social media posts by the centre and went to number 1 on the Itunes comedy playlist.

She added: "I wanted to help the wonderful charity. I thought I could help best through my music. I wrote Cuthbert the Goose's music and lyrics on my piano and sent it to Pete Lamb who has a music studio in Potterne. I didn't realise how much people would love the song."

COUNCIL BLASTED OVER POOR POTHOLE REPAIRS

Dog walker Des Burnett has accused Wiltshire Council of wasting council taxpayers' money by doing shoddy work on potholes.



Retired engineer Mr Burnett uses Conscience Lane, Rowde, several times a week to take his dogs to walk on Roundway Hill. He had noticed the road deteriorating and was pleased when signs went up saying it was to be resurfaced. But after a closure of more than a week in November he spotted that many potholes quickly reappeared.

He said: "The works will have cost Wiltshire rate payers a considerable amount but the quality of the resurfacing is appalling. In less than six weeks there are countless potholes, some are several feet wide and very deep."

Mr Burnett takes his springer spaniels Zac and Ollie to the paths at the top of Roundway Hill three or four times a week. He said: "The parts of the road where they did a proper resurfacing job are still fine but the places where they just used gravel to fill the holes has been a waste of time. The gravel has just washed away. I have counted 18 potholes within the resurfaced stretch. I don't see the point in carrying out the work if it is going to last such a short space of time. Some serious questions need asking of Wiltshire Council regarding the cost of this work and the unacceptable state after just six weeks."

Cllr Bridget Wayman, cabinet member for highways, said: "We spend around £20m per year on major maintenance, including resurfacing and was allocated £7.3m from the Government's pothole fund. The wet weather and cold temperatures at this time of year plays havoc with the roads and our team works hard to ensure people have as smooth a journey as possible. We are in contact with our contractors to address the issues that have been caused by the bad weather. Although the method they used is a tried and tested method of remediation, the wet weather and poor drainage meant the specific standards were not achieved. The contractor has been on site since and carried out some further work however we will monitor it over the winter period and return in the summer to carry out major works. We apologise that Mr Burnett didn't get any response to his enquiry on this occasion. The best route to report issues is via the MyWiltshire reporting system which ensures our team will investigate as soon as possible."

RIGHT ROYAL WAY TO SAVE OCEANS

Student Oliver Dawe-Lane will be rubbing shoulders with royalty when he joins a team attempting to row non-stop around Great Britain to raise money for an ocean conservation charity.

Oliver, 21, who grew up in Rowde and is a former pupil of The Mill School, Potterne will be joined by three team mates including Arthur Chatto whose grandmother was Princess Margaret and whose great aunt is The Queen. Oliver, who was a sports scholar at Millfield School in Somerset, will also be joined by Frasier Cutt, 21 and Charles Bromhead, 21. All four are studying at Exeter University and are united by their desire to raise cash for the charity Just One Ocean by completing the marathon row in June.

Oliver, who is skipper of the team, is a keen sportsman who played cricket for Potterne and rugby for Devizes. He said: "Just One Ocean is set on tackling the grave issue of ocean pollution and we are hoping to raise as much money and awareness as possible."

The lads have called themselves team Exe Endurow to show their Exeter University links and the endurance level of their challenge.

The team said: "We're raising £150,000 to support Just One Ocean, helping to secure a sustainable future for Britain's waters. We come from different schools, different hometowns, different sports, different degrees but a shared goal. We are a group of final year students from the University of Exeter.

We have a diverse set of interests; ranging from mountaineering, trail running and rugby. We don't underestimate the challenge, we think it's going to be very tough, but we like the idea of entering as a team and knowing we will have as hard a time as one another.

This charity undertakes projects, and develop solutions working alongside local communities."

WHAT TO DO IN THE GARDEN IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH

February feels like a turning point in the garden. It's still cold outside, but there are signs of spring's imminent arrival everywhere you look. Bulbs are slowly emerging from the ground, and the days are getting longer at last.

This month's garden jobs are mostly about getting things ready for the spring. But there are also some early sowing and growing tasks to do.

Use February to get yourself properly prepared for springtime. The following jobs will set you up for your best growing season yet:

- Prepare your seed beds. As long as the ground isn't frozen, you can cultivate beds and start to warm up the soil, with fleece, polythene or cloches, in preparation for sowing in the coming months.
- Organise this year's seeds by sowing date. Get hold of a box with dividers, and file your seed packets by the month they need to be sown in. You'll be so glad of this effort in the weeks to come.
- Check your tools are sound and your garden machinery is working. Give your tools and equipment the once over and apply a little TLC to anything that needs it.

 Blitz perennial weeds in your beds and kitchen garden. Dig them up, roots and all, to get a head start on the blighters before the weather warms up.

By mid-March, we're ready to welcome the start of spring - a hopeful, happy time for us gardeners. There's lots to be done outside, now the slower winter months have passed. You'll find March's sowing and growing tasks here. Or read on to find the other important garden jobs for this month: This month's timely tips are all about getting a head start in the garden.

- Fertilise your beds. Once your soil is workable, dig a 5cm (or more) layer of compost or well-rotted manure into your beds to prepare for the growing season ahead. You can also work in a general-purpose fertiliser, such as pelleted chicken manure, or fish, blood and bone.
- Put supports in. If any of your garden plants need supporting this year, put them in now, so plants can grow up through them. Adding supports afterwards is trickier and often looks unattractive.
- Move deciduous trees or shrubs. Now is the time to do this task, provided the soil isn't frozen or waterlogged.
- Resurface paths before plants start to grow and smother them.


