THE BUZZ ABOUT BEES

Swarming Revisited

The queen bee rules not through fear or kindness but through smell.


She produces a cocktail of smelly substances (pheromones) called collectively queen substance. Pheromones are chemicals an animal produces that have an effect outside the body, on another animal - usually the same species (but not always). (As opposed to hormones, which are chemicals that an animal produces which have an effect inside the body - like adrenaline). The queen bee's pheromones are spread through the hive by the worker bees. This keeps the bees busy and suppresses swarming. When there are too many bees, or the hive is too small and cramped so that the bees can't move freely or if the queen is getting on in life, then there isn't enough queen substance to go around. The colony of bees then goes into swarming mode. What happens inside the hive I covered two years ago (RVN Apr/May 21) if you want to look it up. We'll look at what happens outside, which is what you are more likely to see.

This cold wet spring has seen swarms issuing on less than ideal days but for preference the bees wait for a warm dry afternoon, and sometime between midday and 4 or clock around half the bees in the hive will pour out of the hive pushing the old queen with them. The swarming is usually a two stage process. The bees will usually cluster round the queen a few yards (5 to 100) from the hive. They will hang off a branch, sit on a fénce or a post, land in a bramble thicket, anywhere convenient. Then democracy happens. Older foraging bees become scouts and seek out a suitable place to move into. The ideal space is around 40 litres in volume, 3 to 10 meters off the ground with a single defensible entrance. This is the ideal, but the bees will compromise on this, and especially when they have been out of the hive for a long time.

But how do they choose? Having found a likely spot, a scout bee comes back and dances the waggle dance (RVNDec21/Jan22) on the surface of the swarm cluster. This dance relates how far away the spot is, in what direction and how close to the ideal it is. Several scouts might be dancing for several locations at the beginning. Other scouts observe the dances and may choose to go and visit one of the locations. If they like it they will come back and start

doing the same dance. If they don't like it, they may actually interrupt the dance to stop that information being passed on. Eventually all the dancers are dancing the same dance. Time for the bees to move on. The scout bees stir up the others and the swarm lifts into the air with a roar like a jet engine and flies to the new site. The scout bees that have visited the site fly back and forth through the cloud of bees in the right direction leaving a scent trail (more pheromones) for the swarm to follow. On arrival scouts again stand at the entrance and fan the same guiding pheromone out to the arriving bees to get them right to the door. The bees and the queen enter the new home and the redecorating commences!



BOOK REVIEWS

'Fresh Water for Flowers' by Valérie Perrin

Though we didn't reach a total consensus, most of our members found this to be a thoroughly original and delightful read. Violette, the principal character, having spent her childhood in care, is devoid of a template for love and family life, leaving Perrin to explore her development of these in a detached and unsentimental way as her story progresses. Also a bit of a whodunnit, the persistence in unearthing the cause of a tragedy continues to surprise till the final stages and brings some surprising empathy for most of those involved. One reader found the time-switching device used to heighten the tension very irritating (it seems to be a trend in modern novels), but others found it justified in this instance. The interweaving of relationships is carefully crafted and (risking some stereotyping here) some of the accepted behavioural norms very Gallic! Highly original in its main setting, the sense of place is very strong and we all enjoyed the feeling of immersion in rural France, especially so for one member who read it in its original version.



Parish Council Meetings

Since the last edition of the Rowde Village News, the Parish Council met on 19th April and 10th May 2023 for Parish Council meetings. The Annual Village Meeting was also held on 10th May 2023.

The Coronation!

On Sunday 7th May 2023, the Village celebrated the coronation of King Charles III with a fete style celebration with live music. The Parish Council expressed a huge thank you to B Zaccarelli for planning the event with her Committee (J Wills, R Berry, H Pengelly, Kirstie). Tom Humphreys was thanked for attending the event as a First Responder. Thank you to all Parish Councillors who helped on the day. Thank you also to the Village Hall for providing toilet facilities on the day.

Please see page 42 for a thank you from Barbara to all key contributors.

Thank you to C Greenwood for personally donating a gazebo to Silverwood School for their Coronation event.

Wiltshire Council updates!

Cllr Mayes reported that 96% of children in Wiltshire have received their first choice of Primary School. Devizes Gateway Station: It was announced recently that there will not be an equivalent of a stopping station on the main line near Devizes.

Potholes: Wiltshire Council has received an additional £3 million for the county to repair potholes. Wiltshire Council has filled 11,000 potholes this year. Cllr Mayes noted that potholes are a national issue, caused by a dry summer followed by a wet winter.

Residents are urged to report faults in the road or other Wiltshire Council issues through the My Wilts App. The App has recently been improved and updated. It is the most efficient way of reporting problems for members of the public and Council Officers.

Silverwood School: the opening of the new school has been postponed until approximately October 2023. Cllr Mayes is continuing to pursue a reduction in the speed limit outside of Silverwood school to 30mph.

Rowde updates!

Speeding

The Parish Council has purchased and installed a Speed Indicator Device. This is currently located on the High Street by Rowde Primary School and will be rotated in due course.

Footpaths

The stiles at the top of Rowde Court Road, and The Common have both been repaired with thanks to Mr Mann, and to Mr Richard Crew for carrying out the repairs.

A local resident is leading a footpath audit for the village to help improve accessibility. If you are out walking and spot a problem with a footpath, for example if signage is not clear or the pathway is overgrown, please can you report it to us. If you could take the "whats3words" code – it would be really helpful for us to find the exact location (link below to download the app).

https://what3words.com/products/what3words-app Also (if possible), please can you include a photo with the description of work needed? It would be very helpful when deciding what tools are needed before the group set out. Thank you for your help in keeping our footpaths accessible.

Village Appearance

Rowde has entered the Best Kept Village Competition again this year. Work continues around the village to tidy up the planters and to weed along the streets and pavements. We encourage all residents to weed and tidy the pavement outside of their homes, if they able to. It will make a huge difference to the whole appearance of the village and to the judges when they arrive.

There is a new planter on the Hill which has been planted with seasonal flowers. Thank you to J Dalley for making the planter and to B Zaccarelli for planting it.

M Somerville will weed kill the weeds along the High Street, and then cut them back when they have died off. The Parish Council has negotiated new grounds maintenance contracts for the village. The large, grassed areas will be cut by one contractor and the

smaller areas will be covered by another contractor.

Playing fields

There has been discussion on providing changing room facilities at the large playing field. The Parish Council is looking to purchase a container which can be converted for this purpose.

• The goal mouths will be stored until the new season starts.

• Silverlands Play Area: new play equipment has been ordered. It is hoped that this will be installed in June 2023.

Planning

Outline planning application to build up to 50 houses on land west of Sands Lane, Rowde [PL/2023/00386]

At the time of writing, no decision has been announced about the planning application to build on land off Sands Lane.

Reed Place: Wiltshire Council are revisiting the sewage connection for the development. The Drainage Engineers are looking for alternative routes. It is anticipated that construction will start on site by mid to late summer 2023. The groundwork contractors will leaflet all nearby houses affected by the development.

Planning Application: PL/2023/01643: Full planning permission. Proposed construction of two Cable Sealing End Compounds (CSEC) to facilitate the connection between new underground cables and the existing OHL, north of Devizes, and associated permanent access roads to the CSECs in addition to temporary bell-mouths created to support the cable construction along classified roads, on Land North of Conscience Lane, Roundway, Land East of Marlborough Road, Devizes, Land Adj Bridge Inn, Horton Road, Devizes. The Parish Council had no objections to the application but asked for some conditions to be applied. The Parish Council asked for a condition to compel the developers to abide by the commitment in their planning statement not to use Conscience Lane but instead to use the Haulage Road on the site from the start of the project. The Parish Council asked if a restriction could be placed on the number and frequency of vehicle movements on Conscience Lane. The Parish Council also stated that it would like a strong condition imposed to reinstate the landscape and land drainage.

• It has been confirmed that the National Grid welcomes applications from registered charities, social enterprises and non-profit organisations to receive grants of up to £20,000. Parish Councils are not able to apply directly for funding.

Planning Applications PL/2023/02163. Chapel House,

Marsh Lane, Rowde, Devizes SN10 2NP: Replace 3 decayed, single glazed arched windows, north and east sides, with like design upvc double glazed windows with addition of structural enhancement of 3 courses of matching brickwork at first floor level. Replace 2 decayed, single glazed arched, non-opening wood windows on south side with same design upvc double glazed windows. Replace decayed, wood front door and surround panelling with similar upvc door and panels.

The Parish Council had no comment to make on the application.

A REMARKABLE REVOLUTION!



Antonia Field, Chair of the Families and Friends of Furlong Close, writes:

A remarkable revolution has taken place in Rowde where, just two years ago, Furlong Close faced closure and it has now been rated "Good" following a Care Quality Commission inspection this Spring. In just 12 months the CQC ratings for both care and leadership have jumped from "Requires improvement" to "Good" under the new management of Agincare Enable and area manager Pete Bates.

This turn-around in the fortunes of Furlong Close and its long-term residents comes as a resounding vindication of the hard-fought campaign by Families, Friends and the people of Rowde and beyond to Save Furlong Close without which the residents would have been moved out and the Close shut down.

And purpose-built accommodation for 28 people with learning disabilities would have been lost to Wiltshire.

In July last year the one-time residential care facility, then owned and operated by Hft, was sold to Specialised Supported Housing and transformed to become a Supported Living Community of six bungalows whose residents became assured shorthold tenants, each enabled and supported to live as independently as they can with person-centred care provided by the management team and staff of Agincare Enable and the Close of six bungalows managed by the specialist housing provider Inclusion.

Not only have the people of Furlong Close been assured of the security of continuing occupation of their homes, but many of their known and trusted carers have stayed on as members of the Agincare Enable team. In welcoming the CQC report Pete Bates says: "The people we support are now living far more independently and are all playing active roles within the community in which they live, which is absolutely brilliant and so rewarding to see. Glowing comments in the report from people living at Furlong Close and their families were great for the team to read and it is rewarding that all their incredible commitment since Agincare Enable started delivering support has been recognised as Good by the CQC inspectors."

Former local councillor Anna Cuthbert, who championed the Save FC campaign with unstinting energy and determination, comments: "This was always the vision for the campaign so that people could stay in their homes and live their very best lives in a supportive and welcoming community. This is what outstanding leadership can do. CEO Raina Summerson and the onsite Agincare Enable team led by the brilliant Pete Bates have turned this service around in such a short time."

For the people who live at Furlong Close, for the care staff who work to provide such dedicated care and for the families, this latest inspection rating brings justification for all the effort and the highs and the lows of the campaign and everyone can look forward to an exciting future.

All that is needed is now is for a miracle to produce an entrepreneur prepared to take on the lease, in whole or in part, of the nonresidential parts of the site, the Marsh Hall, the admin and craft/workshop block and the orchard and horticulture areas and to develop them for the benefit of the entire local community.



The Caenhill Countryside Centre is just on the edge of the parish of Rowde (the entrance is directly opposite the turning for Rowde off the dual carriageway) where we have recycled an old dairy farm.

Our project runs as an Outdoor Learning Centre where we give our placements, students, community groups and cared-for teams classes and school groups a chance to engage and learn in an active learning area. We strive to link the countryside to the wider communities - locally and across the world. During the Lockdown times we needed to keep them in touch and continue sharing our project day by day, so we took to social media. Here we could connect, share the positive messages, and show them how animal life and the countryside continues. Through this our regular students and regular supporters felt part of the life still, happy they could share, comment, see the good work.





It is Springtime so we are seeing the countryside come to life - new animals born, plants and flowers coming up, trees and shrubs now in bud.

One newer area is the growing area. We will work with the students as they prepare to grow food by planting seeds - logging how they grow, the length of time taken, the amount of care needed to be able to harvest the crop - and harvest their own workbooks of the plants' lives.

From here they will then learn how to prepare and use the harvest crops and how much of the plant can be used e.g. carrots can make tasty food and also tasty food with the green tops to feed the goats, sheep, rabbits and some birds.

No waste as all of the plant can be used for food - people or animals or can become compost.

Our recycled farm is a hit with most people who engage with us - whether as a placement, a tour visit, a volunteer - or via our Social Media.

MAJOR CHANGES TO SEND SCHOOL APPROVED



Major changes have been approved for the special needs Silverwood School campuses at Trowbridge, Chippenham and Rowde.

The Chippenham and Trowbridge campuses will now only offer primary-age education and all secondary education will be done at the Rowde Campus once the new facilities being built are completed. The council do not have a definitive date for when this work will be complete but there will be an additional 33 classrooms to take on the new students. On top of this, the Chippenham and Trowbridge campuses will undergo a £3.6m upgrade plan and will now only accommodate 75 pupils each. This was all approved at the cabinet meeting on May 2 but the £38m Rowde extension has been ongoing since 2021 along with an extensive refurbishment approved in December last year.

However, there has been some concern from parents about moving all secondary education to the Rowde campus. Councillor Jo Trigg said: "For some it can be concerning because they may have chose the Trowbridge site because they thought it would be a through school. "The transition from primary to secondary is particularly bad for people with SEND and it could be very anxiety-inducing having to travel further and get minibuses." But added she felt reassured after Cabinet Member for education Laura Mayes told her during the cabinet meeting that the school as working to give support to the concerned parents.

Councillor Mayes said in a statement: "These plans will secure the long-term future of all three sites and help address the need for SEND places in Wiltshire. Our SEND numbers are increasing year on year and this is a key part of our plan to invest."



LOCAL COMMUNITY GROUPS CAN NOW APPLY FOR FUNDING

My office is once again looking to help fund voluntary groups, organisations and charities that tackle major issues like anti-social behaviour, drug and alcohol related crimes and supporting young people.

Each year we work in partnership with Wiltshire Community Foundation (WCF) to award grants to community and voluntary groups who support the delivery of my Police and Crime Plan. It's a really great way for us to give back to the community with the money raised from unclaimed property.

I wanted to make the grants even more accessible for those smaller community groups this year, so the eligibility criteria and application process itself has been redesigned as well as there now being multiple opportunities to apply throughout the year.

In previous years we have awarded thousands of pounds to some incredible causes which have made a huge difference to the lives of people living in Wiltshire and Swindon, including Youth Adventure Trust which works with vulnerable and disadvantaged children aged 11-16 from deprived areas to run activity days for young people.

Another example is Warminster and Westbury youth clubs which were forced to close during the lockdowns. The grant enabled the clubs to cover the costs of reopening in line with guidelines and to ensure they were Covid-safe.

IMPROVEMENTS STARTING TO DELIVER

Wiltshire Police has faced low points in the last year but it is becoming clear some of the improvements put in place are starting to deliver - and with a new leader at the helm, the Force is in safe, steady, hands.

Chief Constable Catherine Roper's drive and commitment to delivering a quality policing service to Wiltshire residents, which is contributing significantly to Making Wiltshire Safer, has been apparent since she took the role.

Focused strategic direction introduced immediately looked to answer the criticisms in the HMICFRS PEEL report with Chief Constable Roper leading her officers, staff and volunteers from the front and with the implementation of clear priorities for the Force: Safer Public Spaces, Violence and Burglary.



Communities have been seeing focused operational work to tackle serious violence through increased engagement, highly-visible, and proactive, policing. This is alongside a commitment to attend 100% of residential burglaries. Currently, the Force detection rate for burglaries is 9.7%, which is a significant improvement, but I will always challenge for more.

I know residents want safer roads, safer communities with more police officers – this hasn't been lost on the new Chief. Significant focus has been given to consistent proactive roads policing stop checks, continued speeding enforcement in hotspots across our communities and increased engagement with all communities.

With support being given to our fantastic Community Speed Watch volunteers by the Force's Speed Enforcement Officers, and the work of the Roads Policing Unit, notices of speed awareness courses, fines and court summons have increased from 192 in 2021 to over 2,000 in 2023's first five months.

In addition, the Force recently hit government's officer recruitment targets, achieving the highest number of officers since 2010. It has also introduced a quicker, non-degree, route to get police officers through training in 20 weeks and on to our streets.

Wiltshire Police remains in the Engage process but I am confident reforms and improvements put in place by Chief will improve in those specific PEEL report areas of focus, for example: victims' service, 101 and 999 improvements, increases in justice outcomes for rape and serious sexual assault.

All of this is really promising, and excellent delivery of my police and crime plan, but I, and my office, will continue to support and challenge Chief Constable Roper to deliver on behalf of Wiltshire's residents.




